

Reconstruction of Medieval Hamlet at Trewortha Marsh

A good number of hashers travelled to Trewortha Farm on Bodmin Moor. The landscape here is hilly and remote. Trewortha Farm is often used as a childrens education centre and incorporates a reconstruction of a Bronze Age settlement and a Medieval village.

The journey was well worth it on a lovely evening. Sadly a couple of hashers repeated my mistake from last year by using Google Maps to navigate. This usually trusty method failed to notice that the location is at the end of a bridleway and there is only one access road. Google takes you on a tour of local farms and forestry plantations nearby (but not that near) as it tries to approach the farm from the wrong direction.

Good Head started by lecturing us about something or other. It sounded like a chapter of 'How to Win friends and Influence People' as he was quite excitable with cries of 'this is why I am a successful person' etc.

He is clearly less accomplished in distance calculations – setting a 9 mile hash route – when he finished he realised that he had meant to set a 9 kilometre one.

Luckily his haring efforts were not in vain as the fast hashers Hobknob, Wobbly and Phil completed the 9 mile loop (14.48 kilometres).

The rest of us passed by King Arthur's bed, an almost man shaped depression worn into stone by years of weathering. We continued past Trewartha Tor and a settlement, finishing on Kilmar Tor.
